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
World Ozone Layer Preservation Day

Role of NCC and NSS in Students Life

NCC (National Cadet Corps) is a tri-service organisation comprising the Army, Navy and Air Force, engaged in grooming the youth – “The Leaders of Tomorrow”. It was formed by the Indian military corps in Delhi and was started with a view to get students' participation all over the Universities, colleges and schools on voluntary basis. It got initiated in India during the year 1948 and the girls division in the year 1952. The National cadet Corps (NCC) represents one of the positive forces in shaping, especially the values of the youth in the country. The Motto of NCC is “Unity and discipline” and its main aim is to develop character, discipline, leadership, spirit of adventure and the ideals of selfless service among the youth of the Nation. The colleges and schools practising NCC issues NCC certificate to its students. NCC camps are organised to make the individuals trained in the services of parades and military training in small arms.

The National Cadet Corps (NCC) is the world's largest uniformed youth organisation that imparts military training to over 1 million school and college students. In fact, it has emerged as a major source of recruitment of officers for the armed forces. Near about 25 percent of cadets currently training to be officers at the Officers' Training Academy, the IMA and the NDA are from the NCC.

Benefits of NCC

- NCC Certificate gives an opportunity in Army.
- Reservation in State government officers.
- Large numbers of NCC cadets are eligible for scholarships ranging from 2,000 to 30,000.
- Many private industries give preferences to NCC “C” certificate holders for various jobs.
- NCC develops all round confidence and responsibility.
- Community development by cadets has set as an example. These activities includes adult literacy, anti-drug, anti-leprosy campaigns, planting of trees to conserve ecology etc.

In addition to this, NCC offers lot of privileges and concessions for its cadets. In India, there are about 13,380 cadets and 223 institutions running that facilitates a chance to young people to experience how life is in the security services of the country. Out of the total strength of NCC in the country, few of the cadets participate in the parades of the Nation. Further, The Army, Air force and Navy have separate battalions for these cadets. The success rate of a nation depends on its youth determining its overall growth. An educated and empowered youth power drives a nation towards success while negative forces among them drives towards acts like drug addiction, terrorism and robberies.

NCC plays a very crucial role in inculcating social ethos in the youth of the country and harnesses their energy towards something useful for them as well as for the society. It undertakes various social service activities like aid to the administration in times of calamities, preservation of environment, blood donation campaigns, construction and cleanliness drives and an effective direction towards self improvement. These cadets are also taught to be successful in

life, as they need to be bold enough to calculate risk even at times of great discomfort.

Another important aspect for a youth of the nation to be familiar with is the NSS (National Service Scheme). It comes under the Ministry of Youth affairs and sports. It was launched in the year 1969 with 37 universities involving in the NSS scheme having 40,000 students participation. Its prime focus is to develop students' personality through community service. It is functioned at college levels with some of the colleges making it compulsory to join it. These NSS wing trains the people about the services for the nation. Its volunteers participate in various services of the country, such as traffic controls, temple rush, etc. These volunteers carry out social service and Rural Development Programmes and help government authorities to implement their poverty alleviation and employment generation schemes. The Unit aims at inculcating leadership and good citizenship qualities in the volunteers.

NSS camps are arranged by the colleges wherein, the government facilitate fund for these camps. The NSS students stay in the villages for some days and render their services to the village. These services include cleaning, creating awareness about the hygienic conditions, awareness about the literacy and serves the old people of the village. Main benefit of organising these camps is that students get adjusted to the village environment. They play street shows and dramas to entertain and educate the people of the village.

Objectives of NSS Scheme

- The students understand themselves better and their relation to the community.
- Identify the needs and problems of the community.
- Develops social and civic responsibility.
- Improves leadership quality.
- Practices national integration.
- Develops social harmony skills.

NCC and NSS are very essential for the overall development of students. By taking part in these activities, students get admission in higher studies, as most of the institutions gives weight-age for having participated in NCC and NSS. While, perusing these activities, students procure various certificates by passing examination conducted by the National Cadets Corps which helps them in getting employment in different organizations, particularly in the armed forces of India. While working under National Service Scheme, students develop the quality of service to community and help the poor and needy. Thus, NCC and NSS inculcate the qualities of both head and heart, for the holistic development of students' personality.
