


- 1. Participation of students in inter college competitions should be encouraged.


- 1. Cultural Cell has been constituted and been instructed to encourage students for participating in inter college competitions.

The selected students are then allotted a fixed number of days (20 days) and shift. Only four hour work duration is allotted to each student per day. A meeting of the selected students are also called there in they are informed about the responsibilities and nature of job. A consent form is filled by the students duly signed by their parents. Basic information about the students, phone number and photograph of the students are included in the consent form. After allotting the shifts daily attendance of these students are also maintained. The students are informed telephonically if there is any change in the schedule. After completing the fixed

number of days as mentioned in their consent form they are relieved from the duties of summer job. Some needy students are given two rotations so that they can earn double amount. Some of the students used the money to pay their college fees and some others used the money for opening a saving account. The daily attendance register is checked regularly by the Principal. He often talks and motivates these students. The list of students completed the summer job duly signed by the Principal is then send to the accounts section and from there it is sent to the Governing body. After sanctioning the amount by the governing body, cheques are issued in the names of students who have completed the job. Most of the students seek the permission to adjust their college fees with summer job stipend.

5. Evidence of Success

Summer job practice gave new wings to personality of the students. Total 55 students were benefitted by summer job in the session 2015-16. They feel independent, learnt new ways to explore their abilities, used the earn money for the improvement of their academics. Feeling of responsibility has developed as well they feel very happy to add to economic status of their family.

No matter how brainless or backbreaking summer job may be, the benefits are much beyond their pocket money. It may not add a lot to the resume but at least will give some impetus to experience column in their resumes.

The benefits they gained are as follows:

Confidence: Most students who worked are better off in many ways than other students and one of the key areas they developed was to excel in confidence. Whether it's learning a new skill, surviving a stressful work environment or learning to deal with a hard-driving teacher or a nasty student; they learnt to deal and hence built confidence.

Time Management: Sitting idle at home won't help anyone but prioritizing, planning and learning to get a realistic sense of how much you can actually accomplish definitely. Summer job helped them to manage time for learning new skills and planning accordingly.

Learning New Skills: A summer job enable many to learn new skills like dealing with computers, filling online forms, formatting of pictures, editing work, printing and many other tasks which could be of benefit in future. This enabled students to know themselves, evaluate their strengths and weaknesses.

Broaden Social Circle: Students of different streams worked together; learnt from each other and hence broaden their social networking through peer learning.

Parents are quite inspired by this activity and have opinion that this will help in imbibing responsibility towards sharing economic burden of family as well learn new work. Visiting parents are motivated to get their wards admitted seeing the students working.

6. Problem encountered and resources required

The main problem encountered initially was to involve the students in proper shifts. But due to summer vacation time we have to make some adjustments according to the convenience of students. Most of the students are willing to work in afternoon shift as during morning and evening they were busy in their coaching classes for competitive exams. At the same time some are engaged in their internship training. A lot of applications for summer job are filed but we could not provide job for all those students.

Some of the students are unaware of online application of admission form filling and are not able to individually help others hence we recruited some students to train them first which resulted in wastage of time. Some of the students were found engaged in gossiping in different rooms instead of their respective duties that created chaos.

1. Title of the Practice:

"Self Defense Classes Nirbhaya" for girl students.

2. **Goal**:

Now a days it is very necessary to make the girl students aware about their safety measures. There is an urgent need of imparting all kinds of training to the girl students to face the dangerous and unforeseen circumstances. The objective of this training is to protect themselves and also to protect other girl students from being a victim of the circumstances. Career College under the aegis of Women Empowerment Cell has initiated this self defense program named as "NIRBHAYA". Career College intends to impart this training to almost all the girl students by the session 2018-19.

3. The context:

In the present scenario in India and abroad women feel a greater sense of fear on the street, in public transportation, in public places like parks, bus stop, market, etc. and also at work place particularly in the night hours. Life of every individual is precious but unpredictable. Self-defense helps you to be prepared for unexpected situations and also to develop mental and physical strength. The crimes and violence against the females have been increasing immensely, in metro cities. In Mumbai and Delhi attacks on women are more common but it doesn't mean that girls of small cities and villages are safer. Every day and every hour there is news of rape, kidnapping, molesting, domestic violence, trafficking against the females and in such cases there is a deliberate need that the females must prepare themselves for their own security and safety. Every woman should take it as her responsibility to protect her-self from such unpredictable situations.

4. The practice:

Self defense and self-protection are important priorities for women. Our training program trained our students to take their safety into their own hands, adapting those techniques which suit women's needs; adding verbal, psychological, and emotional skills; and integrating a critical gender consciousness into their trainings. Most of the women's self-defense programs are designed to teach them simple techniques that can be applied by women against larger and stronger assailants. Most of these courses also incorporate a verbal assertiveness component with some measure of interactive practice, and provide information on gendered violence. Some programs offer adrenal stress training or conditioning with a padded attacker, while others do not.

Our self-defense program is a combination of techniques drawn from martial arts and assertiveness taught within different pedagogies. The major tactics included in the training Session are:

Exercises, Kick, Padding, Jump, Running, Mock fights with boys, protecting themselves from strangers, protecting them when stranded in a lonely or desolate places, protecting them from assaulting weapons like knife, stick, chains, etc. and protecting them from being gagged and tied by rope, duppata, saree, etc.

Girl Students enrol in college self-defense courses will improve their self-confidence, to become more assertive and learn verbal boundary setting skills, and because of fears relating to being assaulted. Our programs help girls to trust one's strength and about vulnerable spots in men, rehearsing simple techniques and the use of everyday objects to interrupt and to escape assaults.

To protect oneself from being harmed, injured or killed is a basic right of every human being. Instead of becoming vulnerable and helpless, wise people learn the tactics and defend themselves. As the person that best defend you is none but you yourself. Women should always rely on their brains for self defense, particularly when it comes to forming the right staying-alive attitude. Using the brain for self defense is intimately tied to prevention. In order to use prevention methods to lower the risks of becoming crime statistics, women have to first use their brains to come up with the right precautions. If prevention falls short, then women will have to rely on their brains anyway in order to implement the physical actions necessary to protect themselves. Our self defence program will provide all the necessary information so that girls can survive in and successfully navigate the dangers of this everchanging hostile world. Whether they are in an urban setting or in a rural area where help might be a fair distance away, students will be confident that they have the skills and abilities to do what is necessary to survive and girl students will definitely make their attacker wish that they'd stayed at home.

5. Evidence of Success:

More than 200 students were benefited from the program. Feedback forms were filled in by the students and were analysed. According to the analysis girls are now feeling more confident and safe. In 2016, one of our student was waiting at the bus stop. A whisper in her ear asked, "Want a lift?", Two twenty-year-old boys were the source of the whisper. She said no but the boys continued teasing her. She didn't lose her confidence. She punched one of the boys and dialled women helpline number immediately and got the help from local female cop.

Rashmi Mudiliar, a student of BSc VI sem. wrote, After the completion of our self defense program now I cannot rely on others for my protection. It was fruitful for me that I learned self-defense techniques" Ankita Raghuwanshi of B.Sc IV sem believes that the training is not just the ability to defend herself, but also help her to enhance our physical and mental strength. Astha Singh of B.Sc II Sem shared her experience to us that "As a girl I feel completely

safe and equipped to protect myself my friend knowing the skills of Self defense. I highly recommend this class for all girl students".

6. Problems encountered and resources Required:

We found that girls were not so confident about their abilities to protect themselves before they join self defense classes. Initially we experienced that girls were not showing interest as they thought they are not fit for martial art but when our trainer explained them about one of the biggest advantages that Self defense classes will build confidence in yourself; it is also a great way to protect yourself and grow confidence in yourself, ultimately moulding you into a confident person. After that girl develops their interest in self defense classes and they not only successfully completed the course but also their friends motivated and sister self defense classes.
